This week the Maths Strategic Lead for the Cam-Academy Trust came in and spoke to teachers about how to develop children's understanding of numbers using a number stick! Staff have also been spending lots of time learning about phonics this term. Our phonics scheme is called Little Wandle. To run it successfully takes lots of hard work and planning, preparation, and training. The children in Reception and Key Stage 1 are making great progress with their reading.

In our assemblies we have been thinking about having an attitude of gratitude and children have been challenged to 'be grateful not greedy' and to 'be grateful not grumbling'. They have been adding ideas to the gratitude box which included the following: 'Every breath I take; hospital and friends; Primark; macaroni cheese; Pizza; having help in class; football; family! There have been some beautiful sunrises and colourful Autumn days recently!'. Children have also been thinking about our school value: **GROW.** We considered how growing takes time and that it happens in small steps!

## Antibullying week - by a Year 6 pupil!
