March 8th:

We are all looking forward to welcoming all pupils back on March 8th .The staff and I appreciate your continued support for the school, and we hope the full detail of the Government's roadmap to reopen the country provides you with hope for an increasingly brighter 2021.

I would like to thank all our pupils and parents for the resilience you have shown to home schooling since we closed. I understand how difficult home learning can be but with your support and enthusiasm our pupils continue to make good progress.

Here are the initial plans for Monday 8th, however I will send further information next week; plus, staff will be completing a Loom for each class and sending a survey to support your child's transition back to school.

All our previous COVID measures will continue to be in place, these include:

- Regular handwashing
- Regular wiping down of surfaces
- Pupils will have their own equipment
- Desks facing forward and set spaces
- Own year group toilets, with one in and one out system
- Lunches in classrooms, in set spaces
- Shared equipment either not used or quarantined after use
- Reading books and anything from home quarantined for 72 hours

*EYFS: Due to the nature of their learning, do have slightly different measures in place but staff manage social interactions, equipment and carpet spaces in the same way as the rest of the school.

Staggered Drop Off and Collection Times:

Year Group	Drop Off	Collection
Year 5 and 6	8.40 – 8.50am	2.55- 3.05pm
Year 3 and 4	8.45 – 8.55am	3.10 – 3.20pm
Year 1 and 2	8.50 – 8.55am	3.05 – 3.15pm
Reception	8.55 – 9.05am	3.00 – 3.05pm

Please remember that if you have children in multiple year groups, you can drop off and collect all your children at the same time.

Please can I ask parents and carers to:

Continue to wear a face mask, at drop off and collection, unless medically exempt

- Only access the site from 8.40 (many are arriving early which means people are gathering on site)
- If your child is in Year 5/6, where possible, please collect them off the school grounds, preferably not directly outside the school gates, as this also causes some congestion
- Please email the teacher with any messages, rather than speaking at the door, and if a meeting is needed, this will be arranged via MS Teams

Staff are going to:

- Wear a face covering when opening the door at drop off and collection
- Complete lateral flow tests twice weekly
- All adults will be wearing face coverings in corridors, communal areas and when working closely with pupils
- Open doors promptly, to stop any gatherings on site

All pupils will be in class bubbles and staff will be based in the minimal number of bubbles.

The updated risk assessment will be added to the school website, next week.

However, the digital world doesn't have to be considered a place of worry for parents; in fact, it can be embraced as a tool for building a better future for us all.


