Key vocabulary

Artist	Someone who produces a work of art.
Abstract	Art work that is created using colours and shapes.
Primary colours	One of the three basic colours from which all other colours can be made by blending. These colours are red, yellow and blue.
Shade	Darken or colour with pencil lines or block colour.
Secondary Colours	A colour created by mixing two of the primary colours.
Tint	A colour that is developed by using light pigments.

Wassily Kandinsky



Wassily Kandinsky was a Russian painter. Many people think he was the first abstract artist. Kandinsky thought a lot about what colours mean and how they make people feel. He believed that colours had a soul.

He was the first painter to stop painting pictures of things and instead paint just using colours and shapes. He believed that this let him paint honestly about his feelings.
