Beatrix Potter

Beatrix Potter is famous for writing children's books including, *The Tale of Peter Rabbit*, *The Tale of Squirrel Nutkin* and *The Tale of Jemima Puddle-Duck*.

Beatrix Potter was interested nature when she was young. She studied plants and was an artist.

She helped to preserve land in the Lake District.



She worked with the National Trust (a UK conservation charity).

Beatrix Potter was born in 1866 in London. Her trips to the Lake District made her want to write stories about wildlife.



Beatrix Potter Timeline

1866: Beatrix Potter was born

1882: Beatrix Potter visits the Lake District on holiday.

1930: Beatrix worked with the National Trust and helped to conserve the Lake District.

1943: Beatrix Potter died. She left lots of land to the National Trust.

1902: The Tale of Peter Rabbit was published.

1922: Beatrix had written 23 children's books.

1926: David Attenborough was born.

1926: David Attenborough was born.

1945: He completed studies in Natural Sciences at University.

1972: He began making natural history documentaries.

Now: David Attenborough still makes TV programmes and supports wildlife charities.

1943: Beatrix Potter died

1985: He Received a knighthood for his work on natural history.
