

Pupil Premium

Additional funding given to schools to help raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils. It is paid according to the number of pupils who were registered as eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) at any point in the last 6 years.

What is the criteria for Pupil Premium?

The economic criteria are:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (unless you're also entitled to Working Tax Credit, and earn no more than £16,190)
- ♦ Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop receiving Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400)

If your child meets one of the criteria below, please discuss with your school:

- been in local-authority care for 1 day or more in England or Wales
- been adopted from care in England or Wales
- left care under a special guardianship order or residence order in England or Wales

If your child has any allergies or dietary requirements please contact the school office.


You will need to pre-order school dinners via Parent Pay. An email will be sent from the school office in September to set up an account.

Assessment

- Continuous observations of child-initiated activities
- Teacher assessment

- Shared regularly with parents
- 'Wow slips' to collect information from parents
- Child's view on their learning through learning reviews
- Child's creations-drawings, pictures, photos of models
- Will complete governments Baseline assessment within first half term

Medical Matters



- •Teaching assistants are first aid trained and are able to deal with any accidents or injuries. You will receive communication via email (from Medical Tracker) if they've received first aid in school.
- •Let you know at the end of the day or by phone of any significant injury.
- •Any sickness or diarrhoea must be followed by 48 hours absence from the last episode.
- •Please contact the school office if your child will be absent.
- •Please complete a holiday form for any planned absence.
- •Head lice are common! Please check regularly and treat as recommended.
- •Medicine prescribed by a doctor can be administered at school and should be taken to the office to complete relevant forms.
