In July, Mrs Sharon Turner, one of our longstanding teaching assistants completed ELSA qualifications.

What is ELSA?

An ELSA is an Emotional Literacy Support Assistant. They are trained by Educational Psychologists to support children in developing social skills, emotional identification, regulation, and expression, self-esteem, confidence and self-help and coping strategies. ELSA sessions take place once per week on a one-to-one basis for a sequence of sessions, usually around 6weeks. Mrs Turner supports children, across the school in the afternoons.

ADHD: Attention deficit and hyperactivity disorder

ASD: Autism Spectrum Disorder

ASC: Autism Spectrum Condition

SPLD: Specific Learning Difficulty

EHCP: Education Health and Care Plan

EHA: Early Help Assessment

What is autism spectrum disorder?

Autism is a lifelong developmental disability which affects how people communicate and interact with the world. Like all people, autistic people have their own strengths and weaknesses. Autistic people have varying and complex needs from 24-hour care, to simply needing clearer communication and a little longer to do things.

There are three common features of autism, which might affect the way a person:

- interacts with others in a social situation
- is able to communicate with others
- experiences the world around them.

Autism Support at GVP & The Cabin Nest

At GVP we support children with ASD through a range of interventions and strategies. These include ELSA, Lego therapy, social communication interventions, small group play and additional classroom or social support.

We are very lucky to have the Cabin Nest at GVP. This is a specialist provision, managed by the CAM Trust to support children with Autism to positively access mainstream learning.
